# **Cottonwood Fire Department**

#### ZoneHaven Genasys Evac Software

The Cottonwood Fire Department is in the final stages of implementing its new software, ZoneHaven Genasys Evac. This software will enable emergency responders to effectively communicate with the public regarding necessary evacuations in the event of an accident or disaster affecting the community. Currently, this system is utilized by Yavapai County, the Town of Clarkdale, the Town of Camp Verde, and the City of Cottonwood. A campaign will be launched soon to educate the community about the system and provide information on where residents can access updates. We are grateful to the City of Cottonwood for their support of this system and the safety it offers our community.

## Community Outreach

The Cottonwood Fire Department is actively enhancing its community outreach efforts through in-person presentations, social media engagement, and safety inspections of facilities across the community. Fire personnel dedicate thousands of hours each year to conducting inspections for fire safety and promoting overall community well-being.

## Cottonwood Fire Department Services

The City of Cottonwood has been actively supporting the Cancer Initiative for approximately three years. This support enables our firefighters to receive enhanced screenings aimed at preventing life-changing illnesses. This initiative demonstrates forward thinking and positions the City of Cottonwood at the forefront of public safety and wellness. Fire personnel are grateful for this support and look forward to expanding the program further.

# **Cottonwood Police Department**

#### Cottonwood Police Department Awarded Two Grants

The Cottonwood Police Department has been notified by the Arizona Department of Public Safety and the Arizona Department of Homeland Security about the award of two "non-match" grants. The first grant, totaling over \$213,000, will be used to combat human trafficking through the use of investigative internet platforms. These platforms will be utilized by all law enforcement agencies in Yavapai County, emphasizing the collaboration and teamwork necessary to address these complex crimes.

The second grant, amounting to \$42,000, will be used to purchase a mobile surveillance camera trailer. This trailer will serve as a deterrent to address various quality-of-life issues and protect critical infrastructure within the city during special events and other identified needs.

# Communications Division

The Cottonwood Police Department's Communications Division recently celebrated the conclusion of a semester-long internship program with students from the Valley Academy for Career and Technical Education (VACTE). Over the semester, the four interns worked closely with the Communications Division staff and had the opportunity to meet and interact with several police officers.

This inaugural program, initiated by Alexis James, Kelsey Jacobs, and Jenn Noss, was made possible through their tireless efforts and dedication. It aims to bridge the gap between essential real-world skill sets and workforce education and development. Each intern presented a capstone project highlighting their key takeaways and knowledge gained during their time in Dispatch.

#### 70<sup>th</sup> Annual Cottonwood Christmas Parade


